

# Access Opportunity Scholarship Information and Guidance Notes

The purpose of the Access Opportunity scholarship is to support those, who do not have financial support to further their Higher Education.

## Award Eligibility requirements

- You must meet or exceed academic entry criteria
- You must be undertaking your first undergraduate degree programme (students who currently hold a degree or who are transferring from another Higher Education degree will not be eligible)
- You must show evidence that you are facing considerable financial hardship and that without help you will not be able to proceed with the course
- Your household income must be less than £25,000
- You must ordinarily be resident in England

**Please note that meeting these listed criteria alone will not guarantee this award as these are limited in number.**

NC IUL will also consider candidates in the following groups:

- students with experience of care
- mature students
- students from areas of low higher education participation neighbourhoods
- students with the lowest household income (students with a household income closer to £0 will be allocated in preference to £24,999 for example)
- children of military families
- people estranged from their families

## Notes

'Low participation neighbourhoods' are areas identified by HEFCE using data of the participation rate of young people in higher education by ward or region. There is a [map of the low participation neighbourhoods](#) which can be found on the HEFCE website.

## Value: benefit and duration

The scholarship will consist of a full tuition fee waiver for the normal duration of your programme at NC IUL.

Annual renewal of the scholarship is subject to satisfactory academic progress.

This includes failing to meet satisfactory academic progress which at minimum means successfully passing all modules (unless specified otherwise within the Terms of Agreement).
